

# Guildford touring side hold on to their record

**G**UILDFORD Hockey Club are so far unbeaten on their tour of the Caribbean. In spite of the heat and the bumpy grounds, their record at present is four wins and one draw, including a win against the Jamaican national side.

## JAMAICA MEN'S HOCKEY ASSOCIATION 0, GUILDFORD 4

In their first game, Guildford soon dictated the play, and an enthusiastic crowd saw them take the lead in the 20th minute. Vernon Thomas corrected a badly taken short corner from the edge of the circle to score the first goal. Peter Child delighted with swift moves down the left wing to score the second.

The lightweight Jamaican forwards were unable to break through, and Guildford continued to dominate in the second half, when Richard Constable and Gerald Wilkinson added further goals.

## ARMY 1, GUILDFORD 1

Guildford found their second game much harder, the Army playing with great stamina and determination. The latter took the lead in the opening minutes, and Guildford did not retaliate until the second half, when they began to curb the Army's attacks.

A Gerald Wilkinson through ball was then converted by Richard Constable. This game gave Guildford the necessary experience for the Jamaican festival.

## UNIVERSITY OF THE WEST INDIES 0, GUILDFORD 3

Guildford again found this faster than most English club games, but well acquainted with the environment, they showed superior skill, with Richard Constable again spearheading the forward moves. He opened the scoring with a solo run.

A David Caddy cross led to Clive Swift scoring the second, and before full time Constable had scored the third.

## JAMAICA 0, GUILDFORD 1

Playing against the probable Jamaican side for the international tournament in Winnipeg and the Pan-American games, this was the first floodlit match to be held in Jamaica, both teams having much at stake. The pace was the fastest experienced by the 11 Guildford players.

From a fine forward attack in the first 10 minutes, it was Richard Constable who scored

what proved to be the winning goal. Play swung from end to end in the second half, Guildford's goalkeeper, Martin Alder, saving some particularly hard shots.

## ST. GEORGE (Germany) 1, GUILDFORD 3

Following the previous evening's strenuous play, Guildford dictated a slow pace in their fifth game of the tour, which suited both sides. Wilkinson and Constable scored for Guildford before half-time.

Both sides missed chances in the second half, but the Germans were rewarded for their efforts when inside-left Kurt Wimmers scored. Peter Child copied the German's solo stick work to score Guildford's third.
